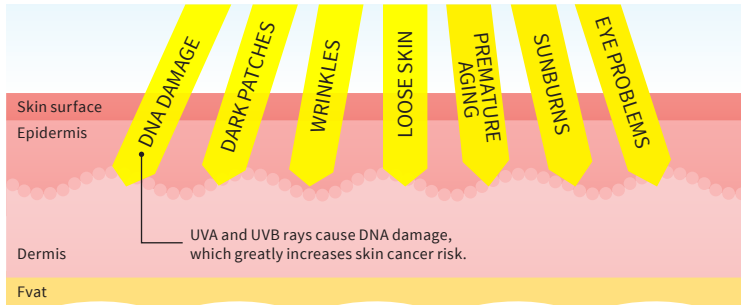




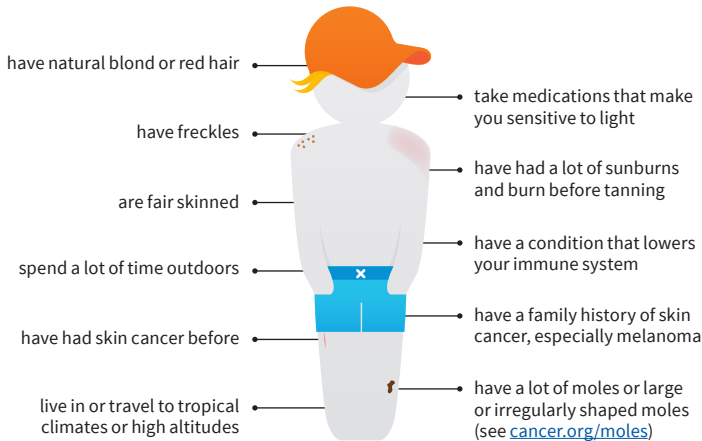
Preventing Skin Cancer
